Reflection: "Our Fathers - Like Jesus' Father"

On this Father's Day, we are using the image of the image of God, as the Father. We know God as the Creator, and our Father is the creator of us, as half of who we are is created from him, as we grow in our Mother's womb. As the saying goes, "It takes two to tangle". Today's readings share the good things that God the Father shares with each one of us, whether we are good or bad; such as the sun and the rain. These reading also share the gifts of protection, of understandings as we grow up, and gifts of love, patience and fun, in ways that only a Father can provide.

Our Scripture today have been selected from Matthew; various verses and various Chapters being read by various readers. Let us hear what Matthew shares about God the Father.

Scripture: Matthew 10: 24 - 39 - Contemporary English Version

<u>Landon:</u> Disciples are not better than their teacher, and slaves are not better than their master. It is enough for disciples to be like their teacher and for slaves to be like their master.

<u>Christine:</u> Don't be afraid of anyone! Everything that is hidden will be found out, and every secret will be known. Whatever I say to you in the dark, you must tell in the light. And you must announce from the housetops whatever I have whispered to you. Don't be afraid of people.

<u>Doyle's:</u> Aren't two sparrows sold for only a penny? But your Father knows when any one of them falls to the ground. Even the hairs on your head are counted. So don't be afraid! You are worth much more than many sparrows.

If you tell others that you belong to me, I will tell my Father in heaven that you are my followers.

Colleen: Matthew 5:16 Contemporary English Version (CEV)

Make your light shine, so that others will see the good that you do and will praise your Father in heaven.

Becky: Matthew 5:45 Contemporary English Version (CEV)

Then you will be acting like your Father in heaven. He makes the sun rise on both good and bad people. And he sends rain for the ones who do right and for the ones who do wrong.

Christie: Matthew 7:11 Contemporary English Version (CEV)

Whether you are bad, you still know how to give good gifts to your children. But your heavenly Father is even more ready to give good things to people who ask.

Jesus reassures his followers that God the Father values and cares for all people, and God cares for all Creation. This might bring us divine comfort. Jesus also reminds us that God does not just bring the good, the sun and rain. God offers the gifts to everyone – good or bad. God cares for all peoples. Parents care for their children, whether to do good things or bad things. As Christie shared, "Even if you are bad, you still know how to give good gifts to your children. God is even more ready to give good things to people who ask.

Our Fathers have done the best they can, given the circumstances in their world and in our world today. For us, today's Fathers, we do remember those times when we have goofed up, or were not the model father we would like to have been. Yet if we have raised our children with those values that will serve them well – then we have done a great job!

Of course I invited folks to share their Father Day greetings and stories. As they do, I invite you to reflect on what they share about their fathers. These stories are from the heart. These stories include several stories where this is the first Father's Day without Dad here on earth. Enjoy!

Video of Fathers Day Greetings:

How much do we look like our Fathers? How much do our kids look like their grandfather? How much do we act like our Fathers? The values of life have been shared and shown in our Fathers works and actions. We are blessed to share in those teachings.

We as the church are to bring about the reign of God to the world today. We will likely only do that, if we have learnt those values from our parents. Bringing the Realm of God to our world is no easy task. Raising children is no easy task. Yet we

are asked to do both! We as followers of Jesus and followers of our parents are called to change the world as we can, and as we are able.

How might we know how to do that? Where might we learn? Who might be our models? Matthew models the strength Jesus receives from God, his Father. Our Fathers have modeled for us how to get out there and get it done! We are not only about listening to our Fathers, but we are also expected to act. To carry the torch, we might say.

It will not always be comfortable, but raising good children is not a very comfortable experience at times. As parents, we did not have a book how to raise our children – it takes a lot of trail and error. Even though we have the Good Book to see how God the Father supports and strengthens Jesus in his work, we will not find step by step instructions. Like our fathers, we need to enter those uncomfortable spaces and love those whom we meet. In doing so, we share God's love with the rest of the world.

There's a lot of crazy events going on in the world today, and it might become very easy to throw up our arms and check out. But we don't! Why? Because our Fathers showed us we can do it – that we have the strength and courage to forge ahead. The Good Book also shares our heavenly Father - God's call to us Christians to act courageously for the sake of God's realm. We are not alone. The Holy Spirit will lead us step by step as needed. Our job is to take that first step! We may be sacred. We may be totally uncomfortable. It is then we remember how our Father held us and said, "Its okay, I will be right here beside you". Whether they live across the street, or 3,000 kilometers away, or even in heaven – their thoughts and actions lead us forward. Thanks be to our Fathers. Thanks be to God our Father.
