Call to Worship:

Eric: Arise, shine, for the light has come.

People: Light radiates. Lift up your eyes and look around. Eric: See how light shines here in your sons and daughters.

People: Light reflects the glory of God.

Eric: Look around.

People: Our hearts thrill and rejoice.

Eric: God is here again.

Lighting of the Advent Candle:

Eric: It begins here where we dare to believe that there is peace for this world for each of us when so much seems to have gone wrong. We light the Candle of Peace. (*Light the first purple candle*).

Hymn: VU 6 "A Candle is Burning"

A candle is burning, a candle of peace, a candle to signal that conflict must cease: for Jesus is coming to show us the way; a message of peace humbly laid in the hay.

People: One candle does not shine brightly by itself. We need more light to welcome this Child and the hope we imagine will come in this holy birth. We light the Candle of Hope. (Light the second purple candle).

Hymn: VU 6 "A Candle is Burning"

A candle is burning, a flame warm and bright, a candle of hope in December's dark night. While angels sing blessings from heaven's starry sky, our hearts we prepare now for Jesus is nigh.

Eric: Light shines to make the heavens glad. Earth rejoices. Trees sing and the sea roars with delight. We light the Candle of Joy. (*Light the pink candle*).

Hymn: VU 6 "A Candle is Burning"

A candle is burning, a candle of joy, a candle to welcome brave Mary's new boy. Our hearts fill with wonder, and eyes light and glow as joy brightens winter like sunshine on snow.

People: The true light, which enlightens everyone, is coming into the world. It is this birth that brings us to Bethlehem to prepare a place for that tiny light that will be the light of all people. We light the Candle of Love. (Light the last candle).

Hymn: VU 6 "A Candle is Burning"

A candle is burning, a candle of love, a candle to point us to heaven above. A baby for Christmas, a wonderful birth, for Jesus is bringing God's love to our earth.

Eric: Christ is born, and so we light this candle amidst the ones that have illuminated our way through Advent.

People: This candle reminds us of the light of the world born on this day, born every day, in our hearts and in the living of Christ's way of love, compassion, and justice. We light the Christ Candle. (Light the center white Christ Candle).

Scripture: Luke 2: 1 - 7

And it came to pass in those days, that there went out a decree from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be taxed. This taxing was first made when Cyrenius was governor of Syria. Reflection: "Gifts for Jesus"

The dictionary defines epiphany as "a moment of sudden and great revelation or realization." The wise ones followed the star from its rising until it stopped. That was their epiphany, but epiphanies are not always so revealing. On this last Sunday of Christmas, we stop with the wise ones to wonder what this birth has revealed.

It is not clear who are the wise ones in Matthew – they may have been kings or astronomers, while some biblical translations say that they are magi. Nor is it clear how many people came, or their gender, but we can be reasonably certain they came from a different country, have access to wealth (because of the expensive gifts), and travel to honour and pay respect to Jesus.

It is believed that the wisdom of the wise ones came from dreams. Herod, too, got his hunch about these travellers from dreams. Herod was wealthy and powerful, was considered an enemy of the Jews, and was paranoid about any potential threat to him presiding on the throne. The wise ones did not bring Herod back information. We are told their dream told them to go home another way

We might think we know a lot of things. Like we know there is three wise men, who came from the East. Maybe it is an Epiphany to you that we really do not know how many or exactly where they came from.

Matthew shared a few weeks ago about dreams to Joseph, and we ask about how we listen to our dreams. Have you ever shared a dream with another and they share they had a similar dream?

Epiphany, formally celebrated on January 6, marks the end of the Christmas season. It is the day when we celebrate Jesus' identity being revealed to the wise ones who followed the star to find Jesus. Matthew's gospel tells that Jesus was a small child when the wise ones found him, which implies that their quest was a long one – a journey of hope.

We have been waiting a long time for the New Year. Now that it is here, how might you reach out in faith to help others to care, protect, and love each other as Jesus loves us. Jesus' dream for a better world is reliant on all of his followers. We are all needed to help, care, protect, and love what God birthed in Jesus.

We are not alone. God is always with us. Thanks be to God.
