Call to Worship:

Eric: Here, O God, we gather - at the crossroads of busyness and rest, of judgment and mercy, of conflict and peace, of wants and needs, and on our Church's Anniversary.

People: Here at this crossroads, we come to hear your wisdom, calling to us over the noise of the marketplace; over the hubbub of competing voices, competing desires, possibilities, and calamities, and the celebrations of our Church's Anniversary.

Eric: Here, O God, meet us.

People: Enable us to slow, to stop, to stand and hear your Wisdom speak to us again: of the beauty of your earth; of the gift that is each one gathered here; the wisdom and joy they bring to this day of celebration.

Eric: Here, O God, meet us today in our worship and celebrations of St. Andrew's 164th Anniversary.

Opening Prayer:

People: We delight in you, O God. We give thanks for Wisdom woven, at the beginning, brought forth from you, Creator God: before land was shaped, before the waters swirled and flowed. People: On this special day, O God we gather as your people to dedicate this sound system to your glory. We thank you for this gift JoAn made, which will enhance our worship; in words and in song and any other sounds we share. We give thanks in your name and will use this gift for your glory. Scripture: Proverb's 8: 1 – 4, 21 - 31 "Wisdom's Story" by Joy King

My name is Wisdom, and I have a story to tell.

Long ago, I felt called by God to speak. I used to go to the crossroads in town – the place where most of the people would gather. This seemed like the best place for people to hear what I had to say.

"Listen," I would say, "wise up!" "I have a story to tell. It's about how the world began. Let me tell you my story."

You see, I was there at the beginning of time. The very beginning. Back when God was creating the world. There were no oceans; there were no springs gushing from the earth; there were no mountains; even before there was dust on the earth. I was there.

Back at the very beginning, before God created anything else, God created me. I'm so glad God did that – it was such fun being there for the creation of the world. As God made mountains and rocks, rivers and oceans, fields and forests, animals and birds and fish, I was there. I got to be a part of it all.

Sometimes it was as if I were an artist, helping God do it all. We would laugh together at some of the things God made, like kangaroos and giraffes – God loves variety. Sometimes it was as if I were a small child, distracting God when things got a little too serious. Children bring such joy and wonder, reminding grownups to smile and laugh and play a little, and to notice things like small creatures and new flowers. When all the creating was done, God and I sat back, and gave each other a big smile. We were proud of all that had been accomplished. God has made a wonderful world, don't you think?

Message: "Anniversary Wisdom"

We know God to be wise, caring, creating, and loving – we see that also in today's story of wisdom, which is connected to God, commonly thought through the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit and Wisdom are one of the Trinity. Today we are challenged to look for wisdom of God in the usual people, ways and places. We are also challenged to have our eyes, ears and hearts open to the unusual people, ways and places, that we see God's wisdom among us. At our Church's Anniversary is a great time to look back at wisdom shared, and to look towards the future believing God's wisdom will continue to be shared.

We can be so caught up in our every day doing, that we fail to celebrate simply being. We overlook the amazing world God has created for us. Pausing to simply let ourselves be, we can wonder at the joy God has infused in our world. On this Anniversary Sunday let us take a moment to celebrate God's presence with us and the joy that brings.

Proverbs 8 is one of the many creation stories in the Bible. The theme of the creation stories all establish that God is the creator and sustainer of all things. Even with different Creation stories, there is always the acknowledgment of God as Creator – that is what is important.

If we had the ability to sit down and talk to the folks who first built this church what story might they share with us? Would they share about how difficult it was to make the decision for all to build a church at these four corners? Would they share how difficult it was to raise the money to build this beautiful building? Be assured this building was beautiful when it was built in relationship to the homes of the early settlers. Would they share the story of how they just knew this is what God

wanted them to do, and they didn't worry about how - they just did it! What story might one share as the church was built? What story might another share about the same church being built? Would their stories be the same? Or might it seem to us these two storytellers are building different churches. That is possible, after all we are human.

Wisdom is one of those books filled with great advice on how to live, interspersed with teachings of Wisdom. We do see Wisdom as an aspect of God (often equating her with the Holy Spirit – generally referred to as feminine in the Hebrew) while others see her as an entity in relationship with God. Either way, she is always portrayed as feminine.

Wisdom is crying out at the city gates, or in the centre of the action in a town. Wisdom is calling the people to task and takes her message to the place where it will reach the most people. That is why we built this church where it is, as it quickly became the gathering spot for the wider community. Was that the expectation of those who built this church?

Wisdom through chapter 8 is a great sense of delight, even fun. The feminine aspect of God shown to us today, wants us to understand and appreciate God's pure delight in humankind and in the world God has created. Indeed, life comes to its fullness when we celebrate creation and celebrate our rich history of faith and connections to our community.

We are loved by God – the scriptures including today's from Wisdom, make this clear over and over again. God delights in all creation. Knowing just that fact, hopefully we can open our minds and hearts to experience God in a wide variety of ways. Can we imagine a sometimes playful God that created us! If you could, would you join Wisdom's eager dance of joy? What is Wisdom's voice saying to us in the church today, especially to us here at St. Andrew's as we celebrate our 164th Anniversary?

Today's reading from Proverbs 8, Wisdom says that God enjoyed the act of creation, and that Wisdom was present with God from the very beginning, helping and playing with God. Could Wisdom and God have been creating and playing as they helped our forefathers and foremothers build this very building? Take a moment and think about the possibilities. What value may you place on this building if you believed that God was there then, and here now? Building a church is a lot of work, yet work does have it times of fun and community. Imagine the

meals the women cooked up to feed the workers; all those pies they made and the fresh baked bread. Almost makes you want to be a part of this creation.

How are we as the church today, being called to create with play to be the church in the 21st century? How do we answer the call Wisdom gives us today, to care for all God's creation?

In the 21st century, we might forget that there is delight in the created world. We can be so focused on the ongoing environmental crisis or the political maneuverings that seek to minimize our lives that we forget the blessing that creation really is. Today we are reminded of the joy that creation brings to God.

Even as in our modern day society we are always trying to improve, update, or refine also everything to become more than it was – God says, "No." Relish it as it is. Relish your human companions as they are. Celebrate the joy of what is. Celebrate these 164 years (and more) of faith that is celebrated in this building each and every Sunday. Celebrate that God created this place with joy and wisdom. We as today's faithful get to enjoy God's wonderful creation – in this Church Building and in this wonderful world.

We are not alone. God is always with us. Thanks be to God.
