Call to Worship:

Children's Story:

Children's Song: VU 269 "The Care the Eagle Gives Her Young" (Tune of VU 75)

The care the eagle gives her young, safe in her lofty nest,

is like the tender love of God for us made manifest.

As when the time to venture comes, she stirs them out to flight, so we are pressed to boldly try to strive for daring height.

And if we flutter helplessly, as fledgling eagles fall, beneath us lift God's mighty wings to bear us, one and all.

Gospel Reading: Luke 13: 31 - 35

At that time some Pharisees came to Jesus and said, "You had better get away from here, because Herod wants to kill you!" Jesus said to them: Go tell that fox, "I am going to force out demons and heal people today and tomorrow, and three days later I'll be through." But I am going on my way today and tomorrow and the next day. After all, Jerusalem is the place where prophets are killed. "Jerusalem, Jerusalem! Your people have killed the prophets and have stoned the messengers who were sent to you. I have often wanted to gather your people, as a hen gathers her chicks under her wings. But you wouldn't let me. Now your temple will be deserted. You won't see me again until the time when you say, "Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord." **

Message: "Conceal Me"

If David is the psalmist, he indeed knows trouble. David was threatened by enemies and loved ones alike, loved and despised in turn, filled up with God's presence and then seemingly abandoned by God because of his arrogance and self-conceit. He knew what it was to fear. He knew what it was to want to hide. But to David's credit whenever he found himself in trouble, David turned back to God. David humbly repented. David sought redemption from God, who is the only one who could calm his fears.

It wasn't David's own strength, by flexing his muscles that brought him comfort. "The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear?" Who do we fear? Fear is an emotion that may use to control others. Maybe even, have others think we are the only one who can bring them safety. We have plenty of fears whom we can place in front of God and declare, "The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear?"

While we live in the world, we don't live by the ways of the world. We are called to live differently. We are called to live confidently. "The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear?". No one!

Have you ever noticed the opposite of faith is not doubt? Doubt seems to be prevalent in the Bible. Doubt seems to coexist with faith rather well. Belief and

unbelief often sit side by side. If we believe without some doubt, it can cause us to be like David in his times of arrogance, thinking we are right about everything. A certain amount of doubt gives us the right amount of humility to believe in God's grace and love.

So what is the opposite if faith? It is fear. Throughout the Bible, we are called not to fear. Angels said it to Mary, to Joseph, to everyone they showed up to see. There is no room for fear when we are filled with love.

You can't get rid of fear with wisdom. You can't argue people out of fear. You love enough to know that fear is just another emotion.

Jesus too is no stranger to fear. Today's story from Luke shares that people are out to kill Jesus, at least to run him out of town. How does Jesus overcome fear? Jesus seeks God's face. If we want to overcome fear, we too need to seek God's face. This isn't just a cliché to make you feel better. Set yourself on the task of looking for God at work in the world. We claim to believe God is at work among us; we claim to believe God is at work within us. So, look. Look for God's face in the face of the stranger serving you your lunch, working on your car, asking for a handout. Look for God's face in the gestures of kindness in this terrible world, in the opportunities to laugh and sing, in the moments of grace with loved ones, in the passion of body and soul. Seek God's face in the beauty of music, in the wonder of the world around you. When we fill up our lives with the search for God, we won't have time to fear.

When we can see God's face in our world, what shows is not us and our fears, but the presence, confidence and the hope of God. We are now concealed in the presence, confidence and the hope of God.

It is out of the desire to bring the Israelites back to God, when Jesus says, "To gather the children of Jerusalem (which mean Israel, but we are also children of God), much like a hen gathers her chicks under her wings. But you won't let me."

Is it odd that the Pharisees have come to Jesus to save his skin? We hear many stories of Pharisees who would like nothing more than for Jesus to find a speedy and messy end. These are those same guys who stumble all over themselves to find tests he can't pass and questions he can't answer. And now we are supposed to believe that they have Jesus' best interests at heart? It may seem that even Jesus suspects something, because his response is an acknowledgment of a relationship. "Go and tell that fox..." he says to them. Jesus declares that he is in charge of his own destiny. Jesus will do what God has sent Jesus to do. Jesus isn't going to run

and hide from anyone – including Herod – the fox!. Jesus knows to whom he belongs, and Jesus knows he is not far from home.

But Jesus is not avoiding the journey he must travel. Jesus knows that he has to go to Jerusalem to give his life. Jesus knows it is God who sends him on this journey. Jesus reflects on the why. "Now your temple will be deserted. You won't see me again until the time when you say, "Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord." Jesus' heart breaks as he talks about the hen and how, "You won't let me", at the same moment knows the cost he will have to pay to save humankind.

We are reminded of the phrase, "The fox is in the henhouse". So Jesus heads for the henhouse to save his chicks. Using words, Jesus' chases the fox out of the henhouse. "Go and tell that fox, (think of scavenger, trickster, unscrupulous schemer, the one looking for more power, and the power of destruction has its limits.) Having chased away the fox, Jesus wants to gather the chicks. Where do we find our safety and security? In the powers of the world? Or in the face of God? Do we go to the one who shelters us in the shadow of his wings? One who has offered himself to be broken, and yet pours out unimaginable love for us?

We need to know love like Christ offers. We need to cling to that love, to that hope when we walk through those dark valleys, and when we feel like motherless children. We as Christians are to live the love of Jesus. All around us, there are those who feel disconnected, those who feel as though no one cares, no one is there for them. There are those who feel that their mistakes define them in our eyes. We like Jesus - need to spread our wings and gather them in. Jesus would love us to do that. We do not travel alone. God is always with us. Thanks be to God.
