Scripture: Matthew 5: 1 - 12 (in Story Form)

Jesus' days were busy. He walked all over Galilee, teaching in synagogues and healing the sick. He taught the good news of God's plan for everyone. People told their friends, and crowds of people came when they heard he was heading their way.

When Jesus saw the crowd of people, he went up the mountain. The disciples, Jesus' closest friends, went with him. When they came to a small flat area, Jesus sat down. This was a signal for the others to sit down, too, because Jesus was going to teach them. The crowd of people was nearby, so they could hear Jesus' words, too.

After time to rest, Jesus began to teach the disciples, saying,

"Blessed are people who feel hopeless, for they will again know that God is with them.

Blessed are the people who see the deep hurts in the world, for they will see that God is with them. Blessed are the people who wait for God's ways to cover Earth, for they will see the greatness of God.

Blessed are the people who look for justice and fairness, for everyone for they will see the mercy of God.

Blessed are the people who show kindness to others, for they will know the forgiveness of God. Blessed are the people who seek to follow God's way, for they will know themselves to be in the presence of God.

Blessed are the people who work for peace, for they will know that they are children of God. Blessed are the people who are shamed or punished, for following God's way for they will be with God forever.

Blessed are you when people call you names because you love God. Be full of joy for God will not forget you."

Message: "On the Right Road"

On this All Saints Day, we are reminded of the saints who have gone before us - those saints which encouraged us in our faith journey. As we talked last week - those saints who had a vision for our church and worked hard to bring that vision to life. Remembering those saints, we continue to reach out towards God's love. We have seen God's love in them and wish to share God's love with others.

For us in the first world, following our journey may be an easier journey than those in our world who are poor, in slavery, or come from a culture of brutality to other humans. Jesus is talking to those people today in the Beatitudes. To those people, Jesus sets forth the identity, purpose, and direction of his ministry.

The crowd, to whom Jesus is talking to, is keenly aware of the poverty and injustices they face at the hands of the Roman Government. Can Jesus really make any difference in their lives and in their world? What about the disciples? They have already thrown their lot in with Jesus, but do they understand what Jesus is calling them to be and do?

For many of us in the modern world, we see Jesus' very life as representative for the character of God, and how God wishes us to act and be in our present world. Even though we may not be poor, oppressed or taught to hate, we are called into a way of living that is liberating and supportive of those we care about in our world today. Jesus invites and encourages them and us, to be citizens of this new way of being, which he calls the kingdom of God.

We Christians talk a lot about blessings. The blessings that Jesus offers in our story today, only makes sense to those people who recognize oppression, poverty and cruelty. Each blessing that Jesus offers is designed to support, encourage, and nurture a way of life that is opposite to their reality of oppression and poverty. One translation of "Blessing" is best translated "you are on the right road." In other words, Jesus says, "You are on the right road when you are in poor in spirit...when you mourn...when you are meek...when you hunger and thirst for righteousness."

If you are on the road toward God's kingdom, the blessing is about the energy, spirit, and power given to everyone who is on the road towards being part of God's kingdom. We trust the saints gone before us are enjoying their reward in heaven. For us who are taking over for the saints, we carry on their work being supported and encouraged by their examples to us. That's why we call them saints – we don't just take over for anyone. We take over for those special ones – those saints who have inspired us.

On this All Saint's Day, who are the saints in our life or in the life of our congregations for whom we take over for? We are on the journey, with those

gone before us and with those whom we journey with today. "We are not alone". God is always with us. Thanks be to God.
