Peter was looking worried. "We have hardly enough money left to buy food," he said to Mary. "And I really need some new clothes. The ones I have are all raggedy."

"I feel afraid too," said Mary. "I like going around with Jesus, telling people about God's love, but sometimes I wish we didn't have to wonder every day if someone was going to give us something to eat."

Peter and Mary decided to talk to Jesus about the problem. "We're worried," they said to Jesus. "We're afraid!"

"I worry sometimes, too," said Jesus. "But God helps me stop worrying, especially about things like food and clothes. We need food and we need clothes, but there are far more important things. Your life is full and rich and happy when we go around and tell people about God's love, isn't it?" Mary and Peter both nodded, yes.

"Look up in the trees," said Jesus. "See those tiny birds? They don't worry. They aren't afraid. They don't have jobs to earn money. But they have enough to eat and a nice nest to sleep in at night."

Jesus put his arm around Peter's shoulder. "God loves those birds, Peter. But you and Mary and everyone else – all of God's people on earth – are far, far more important than the birds."

"I know that's true, Jesus," said Mary. "But maybe the birds don't feel afraid the way I do."

"I'm sure they don't, Mary," said Jesus. "But if you feel really, really afraid – if you worry all night long – is that going to bring you lots of food. Is that going to bring you some new clothes, Peter?"

Jesus sat down on the grass under the trees. "Look here," he said. "See this tiny little lily? Isn't it beautiful? Even the great King Solomon, when he dressed up in the best clothes he had – even King Solomon wasn't as beautiful as this tiny little flower."

"I think I know what you are going to tell us now," said Mary. "God loves this little flower, but God loves us way more. Way, way more!"

"Yes," said Jesus. "Of course we need to be careful. We need to work so that we have food and clothes. God knows that we need to eat and keep warm. But the most important thing is to live God's way – to say thank you to God for the kindness and the love we feel. If we do that, we won't worry as much about clothes and food."

Message: "Caring With Thanksgiving"

Today's message is a reminder that we already have many blessings and that we should not worry about the small things. We all know of affluent people who have lots of money, but are always worried about something. What good does this worrying do? It is said that 90% of what we worry about never comes true. Yet people worry so much about something that it keeps them awake at night. When they share their worry with someone else that person can remind them that they are much more resourceful than the things they are worrying about.

Jesus shares this with Peter and Mary that God cares for the little birds, and the little birds do not worry. They just head out knowing where to look for food, and that's exactly what they do. They head out for the food. Yet Peter and Mary are worried about whether they can afford food and clothing. Jesus reminds them that their job is to share God's love with everyone they meet. In doing what they are enlisted to do, they will find folks who will listen, and find folks who will offer them a meal and maybe even lodging.

Peter and Mary are happy with the job that has been entrusted to them. Go! Do! - what God has called you to do and don't worry – God will provide for your needs. Worry will not get the job done – so quit the worrying and get to work.

I wonder what it may have been like ten thousand years ago, when humans woke up to an empty stomach. They would head out to 'work", which meant going and finding food. Did they ever worry whether they would find something? Or did they just keep looking until they did? Their work would involve foraging or hunting. Their work had a more direct result than what we get from work today. You would forage, find a root, and eat it. You would hunt an animal and eat it, maybe even right there. It was a much different time from today.

Today you go to work at a job. Your work depends on other people and usually on circumstances you cannot control. You work today and you get paid in two weeks or in a month, depending on your pay schedule. Results from your work are not an immediate outcome. You will need to learn some budgeting, as money is limited to your amount of pay. Today many of us are so removed from the land that we do not grow gardens or raise chickens. No, we go to the grocery store and buy everything.

Worrying about things may be easier today, especially when we are not in control of so many things. But as Jesus says, "Worrying will not make it happen". Go to work and keep busy and that which you are worrying about will pass quickly, because first of all because you are too busy to worry about it, and second of all it never comes true.

Then Jesus shows us the flowers in the field and how beautiful they are without clothes, make up or face lifts. They are more beautiful than all the special clothes King Solomon wore. If God cares for the lilies in the field – God surely cares for me and you.

Today is Thanksgiving Sunday and that time of year that we look to say thanks for our gifts and to share what we have with others, especially food. It may be a good time to take stock. To think about those things you worried about over the past year. How many came true? How many were solved because of your worry? How has your body suffered because of the worry? Therefore we have even more to be thankful for.

Let us give thanks for all those blessings we receive. Let us give thanks for all those relationships we have built upon this past year. Let us give thanks for the bountiful harvest, for the good food and for great family and friends. We have so

much to be thankful for. Because we are not alone. God is always with us. Thanks be to God.
