Scripture: Deuteronomy 34: 1 - 12 (in Story Form) Read by Tim and Judy Jackson

Moses had been leading the people of Israel for 40 years. He was now 120 years old! He could see very well, and he still had lots of energy.

He had led the people from slavery into freedom, and he led them through life in the desert. During that time, Moses acted as God's spokesperson. God would speak to Moses, and Moses would tell the people what God said. God often chose to speak with Moses from a mountaintop.

One day, Moses went up a mountain called Mount Nebo. From the high place, God showed Moses land that stretched a very far distance. Moses could see flatlands, valleys, trees, cities, and even the sea.

God told Moses that this land that he could see was very important. This was a land of promise, a land where the people could finally settle after 40 years of living and travelling through the wilderness! This was a place they could call home. Here they could grow their food and raise their families. This was a place where they could be happy and free and where they could build and plant.

Guided by God, Moses had led the people to this new land. After Moses saw the land and talked with God, but before the people entered the land, Moses died. The people were very, very sad. They mourned and cried for many days.

Moses had been an incredible leader. There was no one quite like him. God had spoken to Moses face-to-face and had appointed Moses to do miracles and wonders that no one else could do. God's power was seen through Moses, and Moses was well-known throughout the whole land of Israel.

When the people of Israel had finished crying about Moses, they learnt that they would have a new leader. Before he died, Moses had chosen Joshua to become the new leader. The people of Israel listened carefully to what Joshua had to say.

Message: "The Power of A Vision"

The time of another era has come. The "mover and shaker" – God's servant to lead the people through the Exodus has come to his time to return home to God. Moses would see the Promised Land, but would not set foot on the Promised Land. Moses' death means that his job is finished and Joshua will led the people into the Promised Land.

God gives us the freedom and opportunity to dream and vision our part in relationship with one another and to all of God's creation. We can look back into the history of Talbot Street United Church and see those "movers and shakers" that has made Talbot Street what it is today. As we celebrate Talbot Street's 148th Anniversary, we thank God for their vision and implementation of those visions.

One of those who come immediately to mind is Alfred Authier. Alfred was instrumental in helping to set up the Ministry Sharing Agreement with South Buxton Pastoral Charge. Alfred put many ideas to completion as he made

presses and helped with the apple pies. Alfred made the frame that holds the bell which you heard earlier, and which sits in front of Talbot Street. Many more of Alfred's visions have helped to make Talbot Street the church it is today, including keeping the treasury solid and keeping the doors open.

Terry Shanks was another who also had great visions for Talbot Street. He made many things needed to celebrate the Christmas Season with the Advent Candle Wreath stand that rotates so you can light each candle from one place. All the Christmas Candles that sit in the window sills were welded up by Terry. The work needed to get our stair lifts to operate smoothly was a offered by Terry's visions have made Talbot Street who we are today, including singing in the choirs and filling in for Santa Claus.

Thanks to Tom Craig who procured flour, apples and other supplies for Talbot Street's Apple Pie Project. For being part of working at Talbot Street and at the manse. Tom's visions and work will be remembered.

Then there is all the visions of past ministers – those who moved you to the next stage and those who challenged you so much you envisioned that next stage without their help.

There are lots of Talbot Street faithful who have shared visions and who are still working on those visions today. At Talbot Street many projects include spouses who work together to make Talbot Street a better place, including the spouses of those mentioned above. God has truly blessed the Talbot Street United Church – which in turn offers blessing to the wider Talbot Street Community. Together we celebrate 148 years of faithful ministry.

I wonder if there were times over those 148 years when we have lost faith? Or forgot about God? Thinking that this world maybe better than the next? Moses experienced all of these times in his ministry. Chances are so have we even if we do not make it public. Then, with help from our fellow parishioners or our pastor, we find again our vision of how we can be God's servant in this place.

We do not know what it is like to be in slavery. By the time Moses is ready to go home to God, the people of Israel no longer know what it is like to be

slaves. The generations living have experienced freedom all their lives – even if it was a tough life in the wilderness. It was hard to keep the vision of the Promised Land for even the most dedicated and faithful of leaders.

In today's story, Moses finds himself on a mountaintop, looking out over the Promised Land, having been told by God that this is where his journey will end. There will be for Moses no celebratory crossing of the Jordan River. There will be no tasting the ripe, juicy grapes and the sweet honey about which they had dreamed as they wandered in the wilderness, munching on the same old manna, day after day. All Moses was offered is a vision of the Promised Land, and the chance to actually see the Promised Land.

Almost 3,300 years later, Martin Luther King Jr. would say, just before his assassination, "I have seen the Promised Land, I may not get there with you, but I want you to know, that we as a people will get to the Promised Land." Just seeing the vision of the Promised Land may be enough.

For the Israelite people the Promised Land was more than the physical land they where heading towards. The Promised Land was the freedom they would receive and the vision that they were the "People of God".

Today as we celebrate Talbot Street's 148th Anniversary, we are challenged to hold the vision of those gone before us, and those who are with us today. We are called to continually hold the vision, which has not yet been fulfilled. The vision reminds us of the possibilities, including God's realm on Earth, and the call of our faith to make this world a better place. Remembering Moses' experience of seeing the Promised Land, but not being able to set foot into the Promised Land, we also remember we are on the journey, with those gone before us and those with whom we journey with today. "We are not alone". God is always with us. Thanks be to God.
