Scripture: Proverbs 8: 22 - 31

From the beginning, I was with the Lord. I was there before he began to create the earth. At the very first, the Lord gave life to me. When I was born, there were no oceans or springs of water. My birth was before mountains were formed or hills were put in place. It happened long before God had made the earth or any of its fields or even the dust. I was there when the Lord put the heavens in place and stretched the sky over the surface of the sea. I was with him when he placed the clouds in the sky and created the springs that fill the ocean. I was there when he set boundaries for the sea to make it obey him, and when he laid foundations to support the earth. I was right beside the Lord, helping him plan and build. I made him happy each day, and I was happy at his side. I was pleased with his world and pleased with its people.

Reflection: "God the Creator of All"

In Proverbs today, we hear the story of Wisdom. Wisdom was with God before the world was created. Wisdom is also known to us as the Holy Spirit. There are so many things that happen within God's great creation that is so necessary for life. Some things that happen are so very wise that the writer contributes its actions to Wisdom. We understand wisdom as being thoughtful and wise. We contribute wisdom to our elders. They have been there and done that, and have a story to share about being there.

Wisdom expands our horizons. It opens our spirit to the limitlessness of possibilities in Creation. Wisdom broadens our understanding of reconciliation. Wisdom invites us to see past our small worlds and see the bigger picture. God is the creator of all, founder of the infinite, redeemer of the heavens and Earth, sustainer of the Cosmos; all that has its matter and spirit within these boundless realms, sing God's praise.

The book of Proverbs is a collection of thoughts about what is good or true in life. What is ethical behaviour. What is valuable and why. How to judge good character. What holds power in the marketplace and in relationships. How to teach children to be wise and truthful.

Proverbs finds Wisdom in everyday life. Yet shows us that Wisdom's origins is before the earth was formed. Wisdom has always been with us. The writer of Proverbs shares with us the grandeur of the universe, and also the tiniest things found in everyday life. This reminds us of all the ways God's wisdom is in our lives.

Today's reading of Proverbs 8, takes shape in a poem, indulging in the details of our shared origins. Throughout the book, the writer explains Wisdom can be seen everywhere, great and small - in the ant as much as the eagle. Wisdom is personified as a being who was in the "beginning of days" and in the "day-by-day." There is no stage in the history of Creation where Wisdom was not delighting and interacting with it.

It's easy to confine ourselves to our small worlds and busy ourselves tending only to the needs of daily life. Today's scriptures remind us that the goodness of Creation began light years away from where we live; that each star and planet is created to praise God, as is each mountain, tree, and animal on Earth. All we need to do is to take time to notice the glory of the night sky and of the grass soaked in morning dew. Although their beauty may cause us to see God in our faith, today we are challenged to see those everyday things as the created body praising God. May we reach out when we take the time to notice the day to day events, to add our voices to creation's praise to God.

It's easy to confine ourselves to our small worlds and busy ourselves tending only to the needs of daily life, especially as we struggle to keep our rural churches open and part of the bigger community. It becomes easier to look inward and reflect on all our woes and suggest that others do not care for us. Many times, it is after the Rural Church closes that the community realizes what the Church had offered the community. Yet if we step back and look at the bigger picture, we can see where we continue to be part of our larger community. Although we do have struggles we are still here, sharing faith with each other, praising God and sharing wisdom with our community.

We as the Rural Church reach out not only to our community but to communities around the world – sharing with the Mission and Service, the Canadian Foodgrains Bank, and other partners. We learn about challenges in other countries, usually affecting their Rural communities.

We pray for others in tough situations; whether it be around the world, or here in our local community. Regardless of what we might think is holding us back – we offer prayer. We pray for those in our community that are sick and hurting. We visit the sick. We feed the hungry. We offer help when needed. We are part of our Rural Community; physically and metaphorically.

We do find Wisdom in our elders. Folks who have experienced life through the lens of deep spiritual faith. In their faith, they offer pieces of wisdom that can keep us the faithful, and us the church, grounded knowing we live in faith, and not so much in absolutes. The wisdom of the elders of the Rural Church is in step with the culture of the Rural Community. That wisdom is not foreign to the Rural Community, as may be found in Government or Regional policies.

Through the act of prayer and belief in our faith of our personal relationship with God, we can offer so much to this rural community. We know there is something bigger than you or I. we know our future is in God's hands. We believe we can make a difference in and through prayer. Because we know we are not alone. God is always with us. Thanks be to God.
