Prophets are people whose ears and hearts are so open to God that they know what needs to be said to God's people. At a time when there was a lot of pain and hurting in the world, God spoke to Isaiah and Isaiah spoke to God's people.

Pay attention. Watch closely now, I am getting ready to create a new heaven and a new earth. It will fill you with such wonder that you won't remember what there was before.

The great city will be a joy and the people will be a delight. Just like a tree has roots deep into the earth and reaches for the sky, all my people will be grounded in love and growing towards love.

Remember the pain and distress of seeing floods and tsunamis destroy homes, or endangered species being lost to extinction and green forests being lost to desert. Remember the suffering of children dying from dirty drinking water, or not having enough food, or diseases that can be cured with simple medicines. Remember the agony of people killing each other for different ideas about what is true or who is right.

And now forget that, because it will not happen anymore.

Life will be full. Every person will have a home and land, planting seeds and eating from their own garden. You will have clean streams of water to drink from and peace will grow like flourishing wildflowers among all people and creatures.

This new creation will be so marvellous that residents of different countries will eat side by side, and people who worship in every way and every language will pray and feast together. The only one who will starve will be selfishness, finding nothing to consume in this love-filled world.

This is my holy mountain. Here, no one will know hurt or destruction. Here, all life will know love, says God.

Message: "Up in the Mountains"

Mountain top views can make us believe we have endless possibilities. Likely that is because from the mountain top we can see the bigger picture. We can see all of nature and animals for miles. This summer we stopped at the Columbia Icefields in Jasper Park, and took the Skywalk tour. The Skywalk tour is out on a cliff-edge, with a glass walkway – 1000 ft above the valley below. The giant glaciers perch above you and the spectacular Sunwapta Valley spreads out below. You can experience waterfalls, wildlife and fossils with the help of binoculars. Being perched high above the views are wonderful, and you may even see the future with promise.

From the mountain top our imaginations can soar to think of new possibilities, including harmony with all Earth. The Sunwapta Valley was home to the Nakoda First nations, and you can see why it was such a special place. In caring for all lands may we help them to reach their full potential. May we gain wisdom from the past, and move into the future, in partnerships with all nations and with God – creating lands free from harm and destruction. That is a lofty goal – likely only one we can see from the top of the mountain.

For the next three or so minutes is a time-lapsed film taken between April 4th and 11th of 2011. It is on Spain's highest mountain; El Teide. Enjoy, as we continue to explore our part in today's story.

Isaiah invites us to look to the mountain top that God is creating. You know, it is hard to look toward the mountains on a clear day and not be awestruck by the

beauty, strength and grandeur. Isaiah captures this vision of unmatched strength and grandeur and invites us to imagine what our world will be like when we imagine God's "holy mountain." God's Holy Mountain is the New Jerusalem, where violence, death, greed, threat, and exile are forgotten. God offers us a new possibility where everyone and everything will live in harmony.

The interesting concept for us is that this New Earth and New Heaven will not come from the destruction of the current Creation. That is why this vision is shared with us humans, as we are asked to be part of the journey in re-creating the world today into the New Earth and New Heavens that God offers to us. We are to transform the damaged land and skies into something teeming with light and love. We as humans are responsible to move towards the destruction of exile, violence and instability. We as humans are to reawaken our relationship with God. This new great vision gives us new purpose – a purpose that is so lofty, it takes us to whole new heights – like to the mountain top.

Looking at the world today we can see examples of these negative and destructive divisions slowly changing. The Columbia Icefields Skywalk could be a good example of protecting the natural beauty and life of the Sunwapta Valley and yet in partnership with the Nakoda Nation, governments and environmentalists, this beauty is protected in a way that we as tourists can still experience the magnificent beauty.

We see entrepreneurs who are changing the world by financing the end of diseases, food shortages and better living conditions to the poorest of our world. Many are making good clean water available. The Canadian Foodgrains Bank is an organization that the United Church is partnering with that shows substance farmers how to grow good plentiful food by conservational farming practices. These families get much more quality food from planting smaller plots – because they are doing the farming in a new way. It makes all the difference to that family.

Providing education is also a game changer. Yet for many who live in poor areas of the world, there is no electricity to study or do homework. Small solar panels and a single LED Bulb give ample light for hours to get that work done and to be ready for school the next day. Solar panels, mobile internets and laptops make the world your oyster regardless of where you live. Folks in poor countries are making a living by offering their technical abilities to companies around the world, using their laptop, internet and solar power. Do we believe that Isaiah's interpretation of God's vision and promises are relevant to us today in the 21st century? Do we believe in God's capacity to reform, transform, and make new that which is harmful to full life? Can we also vision, with Isaiah, God's holy mountain where God's renewed Creation will celebrate and live together in peace. Isaiah shares the vision of all mountains being a sacred symbol of God and God's creation. God's Holy Mountain creates "Heaven on Earth" and a new realm that exists beyond our current one.

As the church, what actions might we see as doable for us to help create God's Holy Mountain – "Heaven on Earth"? If it's not us, the faithful and the believers – then who?

Living in the midst of the climate crisis and COVID-19 pandemic, we have an even greater desire to find hope for the future. To help create the vision that God puts forth, we must step forward, we must care for one another, and we must care for Planet Earth. On God's holy mountain, God delights in transforming Creation into something that will continually bless humanity and others in the created order. We are not alone. God is always with us. Thanks be to God.
